

INDOOR PRACTICES

All indoor practices will take place at the Milwaukee Angels' 35,000 sq foot facility in Muskego, WI or our newly expanded facility in Brown Deer, WI. Generally, each team practices weekly from November to April. Generally, each team is given 180 minutes (3 hours) of practice time each week that take place from November-April on both weeknight and weekday timeslots. Outoor practices take place at local fields determined by coach's preference and field availabilty.

We understand and appreciate that many of our players are multisport athletes and may not be able to attend every practice due to conflicting schedules. All players are expected to mark their availability for each practice/game using the Team's preferred platform to to allow for our coaches to make successful practice and game plans.

FACILITY

The Halo Facility (Muskego, WI) and The Halo North Facility (Brown Deer, WI) are used by the Midwest Halos and Milwaukee Angels baseball and softball teams to train and develop. All of our teams utilize the facilities and their amenities throughout the year. Individual players have the ability to reserve cage time as part of their annual players fees as we prioritize the training and development of our athletes. The Halo Facility features a 6,000 sq. ft. weight room, a full infield, 5-8 cages, 160 ft. long toss/velocity tunnel, pitching machines and a plyo wall. The facility features a parents waiting area with digital viewing and window access to the training facility, as well as, a team store and concession stand for special events.
